



Intent

Our robust Scheme of Learning is based on the PSHE Association's SEND Curriculum. It aims to equip learners with essential skills for life. It intends to develop the whole young person through carefully taught lessons that support the acquisition of the knowledge, skills and attributes that all children and young adults need to protect and enhance their wellbeing. Through the PSHE learning journey, all our learners will understand how to stay safe and healthy, build and maintain successful relationships and become active citizens. Our learners will be able to responsibly participate in society. We want all our learners to be the best person they can be at Weatherfield Academy.

BRITISH VALUES / CITIZENSHIP

All PSHE lessons have their foundations in seeing each and everybody's value in society; from the appreciation of others to promoting strong and positive views of self. Our topics in the rolling programme support social, moral, spiritual and cultural (SMSC) development and provide learners with protective teaching on essential safeguarding issues (for example, the NCPCC's '*Pants Rule*') and developing their knowledge of who, when and how they can ask for help.

Implementation

Our programme of study is designed to be taught in thematic units which build over the key stages. They feature as part of a spiral curriculum (based upon the PSHE Association's SEND curriculum) that revisits each theme every two years or more, depending on the topic. This enables Learners to recall and build upon previous learning, exploring the underlying principles of PSHE education regularly at a depth that is relevant, appropriate and accessible for their age and ability. Teachers are able to use the medium term plans to deliver the lessons in a creative manner, using many approaches such as role play, discussion and games with groups of various sizes, including paired work. These activities enable learners to build confidence and resilience and an appreciation of teamworking. Teachers have the freedom to adapt how they teach the curriculum according to their strengths and style of teaching.
