### **ABOUT KS4**

In Key Stage 4, our curriculum is designed to prepare students for adulthood. We offer accreditations in English and Maths through Functional Skills and Certifications, ranging from Entry Level 1 to Level 1/2. Our goal is for pupils to gain the qualifications and experiences they need to access the next appropriate course, apprenticeship or pathway in their education. We also support pupils to confidently apply their skills, knowledge and understanding in a wide range of real-life situations.

#### During Key Stage 4, pupils will:

- complete a baseline assessment within their first six weeks.
- Access carefully planned lessons that develop and strengthen key skills and knowledge.
- Be encouraged to discuss, debate and share their views on topics that matter to them.
- Receive ongoing assessment (both formative and summative) so teachers can tailor learning to their needs.
- Follow a carefully sequenced curriculum where new learning builds on what they already know and can do, working towards clear end points.

#### By the end of Key Stage 4, pupils will:

- Be digitally confident and able to keep themselves safe online.
- Have developed stronger social, communication and interaction skills.
- Be able to apply their knowledge, understanding and skills in a wide range of contexts.
- Achieve qualifications and experiences that support their next step in education or training.
- Communicate their needs, preferences and ideas clearly in different settings.
- Show greater independence in managing physical, sensory and emotional challenges.
- Demonstrate increased confidence and resilience when facing real-world and work-related situations.
- Be well prepared for a positive transition into adulthood, with support tailored to both their therapeutic and academic development.

## **KS4 MATHS FUNCTIONAL SKILLS**

During this half term students will consolidate their work from the previous half term on place value and addition and subtraction. They will continue to work on their maths fluency skills by over learning their number bonds (addition and subtraction) and times table facts. They will continue to practise their money skills in their independent living lessons.

#### Students working towards Entry Level 1

- addition and subtraction within 20
- solve word problems involving addition and subtraction
- Tell time to the hour (o'clock) and half hour
- Use the language of time (before/after)
- learn the order of units of time (seconds, minutes, hours, days etc)

#### Students working towards Entry Level 2

- Addition and subtraction within 100
- Solve missing number problems
- Time tell time to the nearest 5 minutes
- Name and order months of the year and seasons
- Multiplication and division (2-, 5- and 10- times tables)

#### Students working towards Entry Level 3

- Addition and subtraction within 1000
- Solve missing number problems
- Check calculations using the inverse operation
- Multiply or divide a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number
- Focus on 2-, 4-, 8- times tables and the relationship between them
- Time convert units of time, read 12- and 24- hour clocks
- Know that there are 365 days/52 weeks in a year

#### Students working towards Level 1

- Time tell time to the minute, convert between units of time, know how many days in a month
- Solve problems involving the 4 operations (+, -, X and division)

### **KS4 CURRICULUM CONTINUED**

#### **PSHE**

This half term in PSHE we will continue our focus on the overarching topic of Health and Wellbeing. This half term will include developing our knowledge around First aid and Emergency services. Students will look at how they can make independent health choices and take responsibility for their health by Screening and self examination. We will also look at the dangers of Substance abuse, alcohol and its risks as well as the negative impacts of Toxic masculinity.

#### **Science**

This half term we will be focusing on animals, this includes classification, adaption and learning about Eco-systems. Students will learn about the wildlife all around them and the important role creatures and insects like Bees and butterfly's play in the local environment. AQA Science group - Students in this group will continue with their AQA science.

#### **Religious Education**

During this half term students will explore questions such as: Why do Christians see Christmas as important? Should it be a national holiday? The lessons will aim to develop pupil knowledge and create a bridge between pupils experiences and the religious theme.

Students will also develop their understanding of symbols and values that are in the religious teachings we are studying.

#### **PE**

During Autumn 2, pupils will be carrying on with their chosen activity options. These include; Hiking/orienteering, racket sports, invasion games, dance and fitness.

Now pupils have choice in the activity they want to take part in, this will help them to remain engaged in a physical task they want to carry on with into their adult lives.

#### **Computing**

Creating and Editing - This half term looks at building strong foundational skills in using digital applications with purpose and confidence. Students practice touch typing consistently to build fluency and apply formatting techniques across different document types. The focus is on clear digital communication - creating materials like posters, menus, and flyers that suit different audiences and purposes, while developing independence and pride in presentation.
