<p>Key focus -</p> <p>Throughout this Short Course students will focus on these 5 main areas: -</p> <p>*The Client</p> <p>*Consultation</p> <p>*Contra-actions</p> <p>*After Care</p> <p>*Home Care</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to introduce learners to the key concepts that underpin customer service in all sectors – these include body language, clear oral communication and the customer or client experience. Learners will be able to explore specific client-therapist interactions in the context of hair and beauty and understand the link between customer service and health and safety in this sector.</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to introduce learners to a number of practical manicure and pedicure techniques. Learners will also be able to explore the history and design aspects of nail services. Learners who hope to progress to NVQ or employment in Beauty will require an understanding of the anatomy and physiology related to nail structure and disorders; challenges in this area of nail services are therefore included in the module.</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to provide opportunities to learn and practise a number of practical washing, braiding and blow drying techniques. Hairdressers require some understanding of chemistry and there are challenges which introduce this concept in the context of hair products. Learners who hope to progress to NVQ or employment in hairdressing will require an understanding of the anatomy and physiology related to hair structure and how this relates to treatments; challenges in this area of hairdressing are therefore included in the module.</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to introduce learners to the techniques used in facial treatments and further specific applications of customer service skills. Learners will have the opportunity to work with different client groups and to acquire specific vocabulary, knowledge of the benefits of individual treatments and the basic constituents of commonly used products. Learners who hope to progress to NVQ or employment in Beauty will require an understanding of the anatomy and physiology related to skin and skull structure; challenges in this area of Beauty are therefore included in the module.</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to ensure that learners are aware of the specific health and safety risks that can have an impact on both the therapist and the client when carrying out or receiving different treatments. Learners will find out about the responsibilities of salon owners and some of the issues surrounding waste disposal in this sector. Other modules also contain challenges with a health and safety aspect so that learners can integrate their knowledge of safety with the way in which they carry out the new techniques as they learn them.</p>	<p>The aim of this module is to support learners to decide whether a career in this sector is right for them; challenges introduce them to different careers and workplaces where hair or beauty specialists are employed. Learners will also be able to explore the different ways in which they could access further training or employment if they choose to pursue a career in this sector.</p>
