OP ENCOMPASS

At our school, we are committed to supporting the wellbeing and safety of all our pupils. As part of this commitment, we take part in Operation Encompass, a national initiative that helps schools provide immediate support to children and young people who may have been affected by domestic incidents. This means that when the police are called to an incident of domestic abuse, they will inform a specially trained member of staff in our school (the Designated Safeguarding Lead) before the start of the next school day. This ensures that we can offer appropriate care, understanding, and support to the child as soon as possible. We believe that working together with families and external agencies helps us to create the safest and most supportive environment for all our pupils.

ASSEMBLIES

We have redesigned our assemblies to promote student independence and leadership skills. Pupils now take on a range of different roles, from setting up and welcoming others to presenting and supporting the smooth running of the assembly. Over time, our aim is for students to take full ownership and lead the assemblies independently. Below are some photos showcasing our new assembly structure in action.
