Coverage

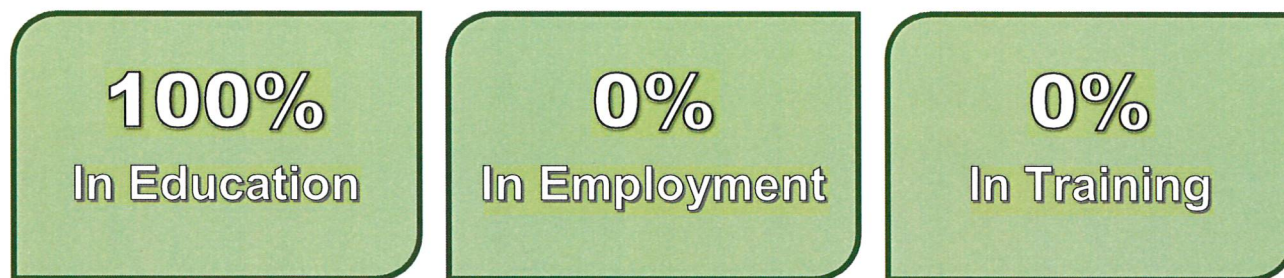
The Annual Activity Survey reports on young people (YP) who reached the compulsory school leaving age in 2020, that were educated in a school or other institution in the Central Bedfordshire area and were recorded within the Youth Service Core+ CCIS database on **31st May 2020**.

Conduct of the survey

The information used is initially sought directly from individual school and college enrolment lists together with census returns. Young people who are not included in these lists, such as those who have not enrolled in a school or College, or where insufficient data is held, will be tracked by the Youth Support Service using various means such as post, telephone, email, home visits and social media. Young people who are known to have left Central Bedfordshire may be included in the survey but those who have left the country will not.

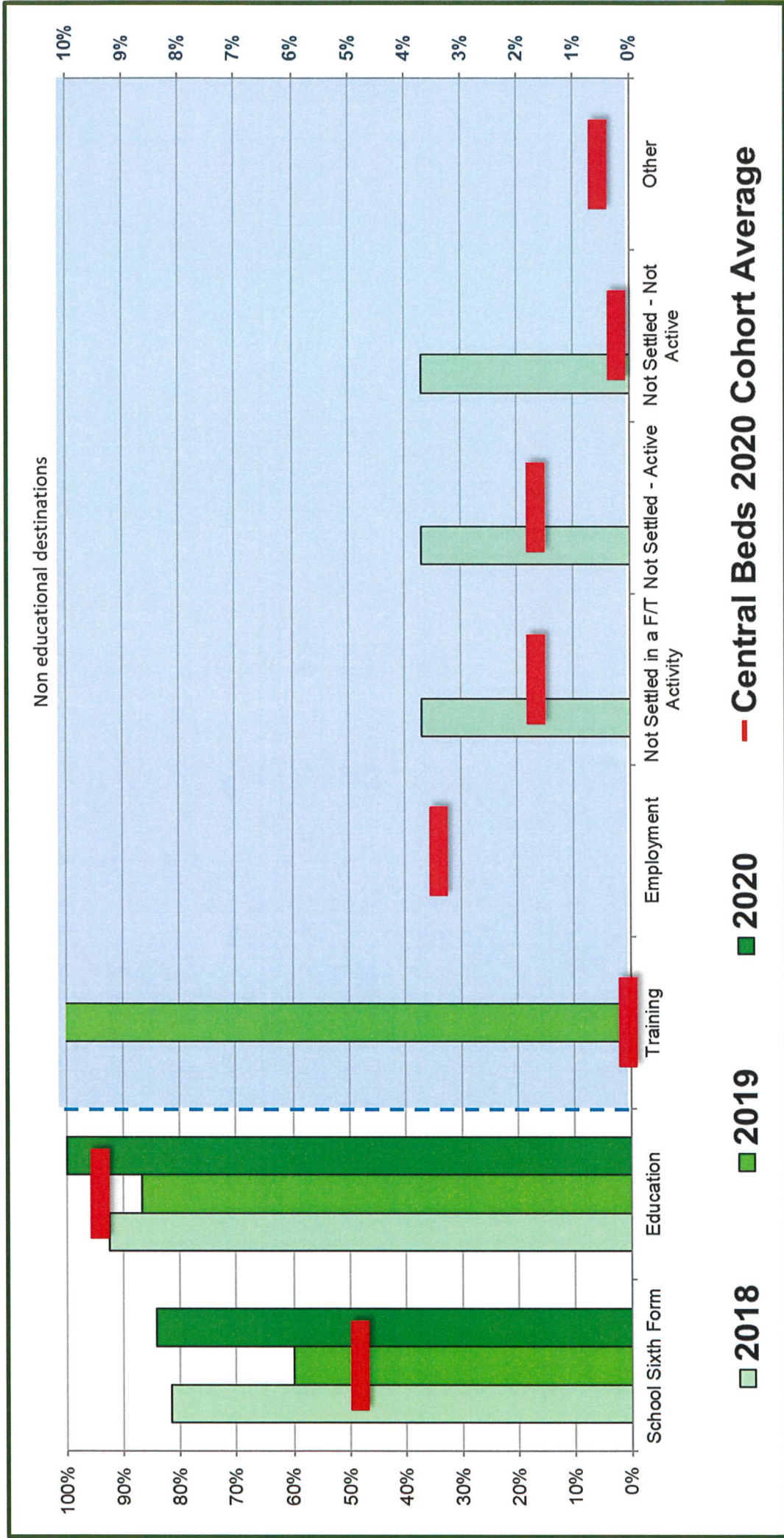

Timeliness of Data

At least six months (October 2020 – March 2021) must elapse before sustained participation in education or training can be measured.

Sustained Destination

To be classed as 'Sustained' a young person would have to be involved with an education or employment/training organisation for a minimum of a six-month period between October 2020 and March 2021. If a young person changed activities between education, employment/training or being NEET within the six months' period, this would mean that their destination was classed as 'Not Sustained'.

Not Sustained Destination

'Not sustained' means that the young person has had a range of education, employment, training or NEET destinations recorded within the six-month period between October 2020 and March 2021.

Raising the Participation Age (RPA)

RPA came about from government legislation, introduced in 2013 to encourage young people to stay in education or training until they are 18. It is different from the school leaving age as it doesn't mean young people must stay on at school. Participation means that the young person is involved with one of the following activities:

- full-time study at school, college or with a training provider
- full-time employment with part-time study or training
- volunteering for a minimum of 20 hours a week combined with part-time study or training
- an apprenticeship

School Leaving Age

A young person can leave school on the last Friday in June if they will be 16 by the end of the summer holidays.

Educational Institution

The young person's year 11 educational institution will be the one recorded on the 31st May 2020 – their last academic year of compulsory education.



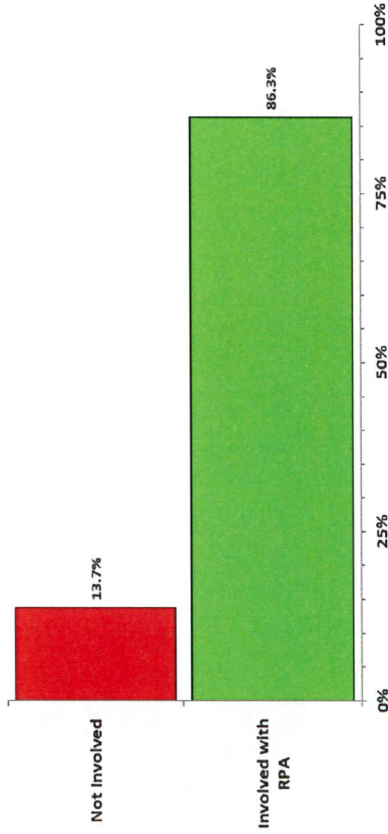

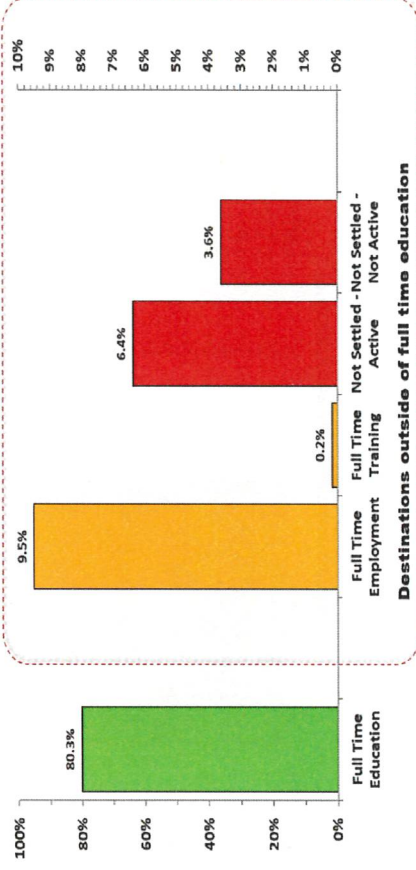


General Overview of Central Bedfordshire's Sustained Destinations

Not Participating includes:

- Employment without study
- Not settled but active in the labour market (NEET)
- Those whose current destination is unknown because they cannot be contacted or have refused to disclose what they are doing.

Full-time education includes school sixth form, sixth form college, further education college, custodial institution (juvenile offender age 16 or 17), home study and other post 16 education.

Full-time employment includes employed apprenticeships, employment with or without study.

Full-time training includes Education Funding Agency (EFA) funded training.

Not settled - active includes part-time learning or employment, re-engagement opportunities or being available in the labour market.

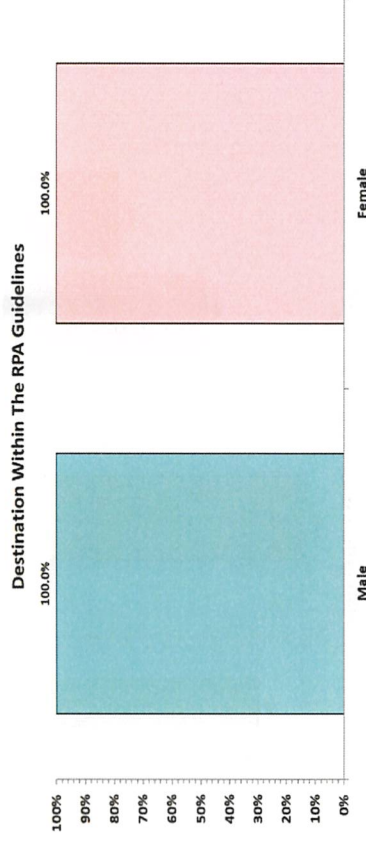
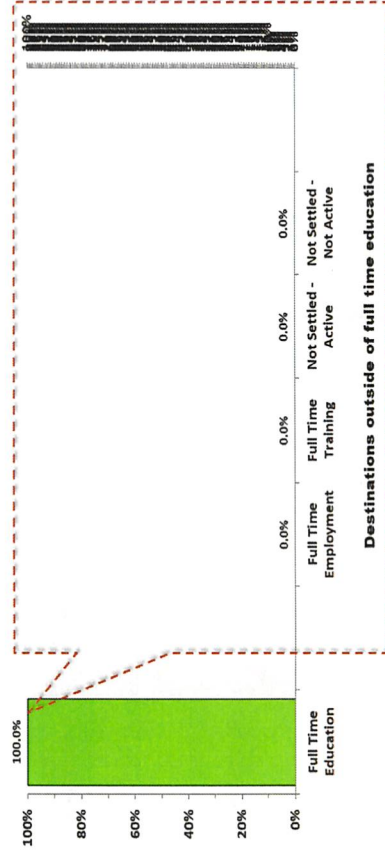
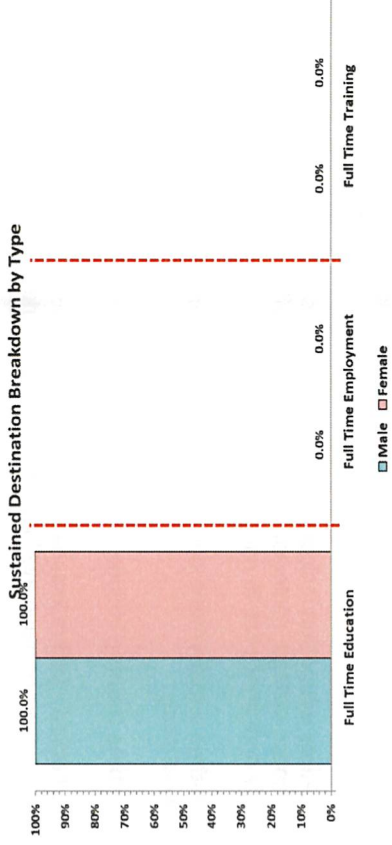
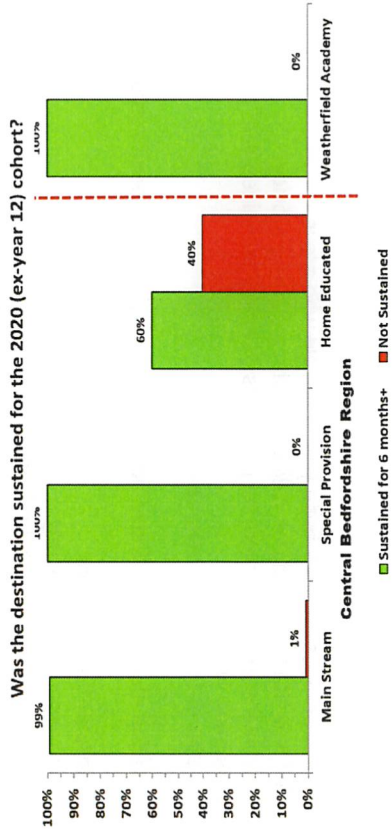
Not settled - not active includes young carers, teenage parents, illness, pregnancy and asylum seekers without citizenship.

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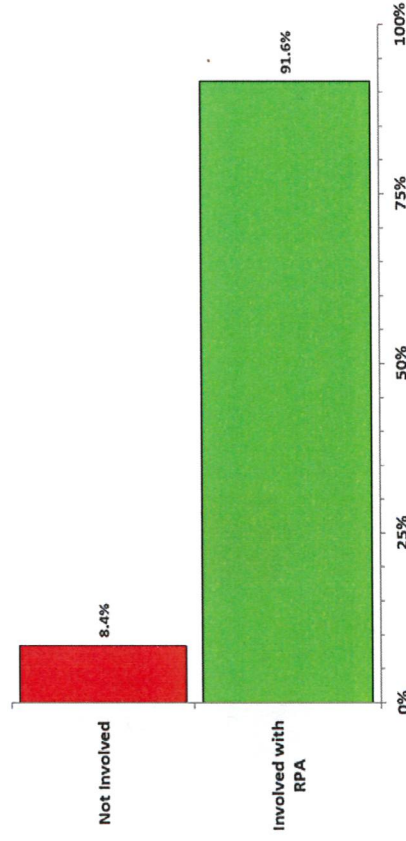


Sustained Destinations for Weatherfield Academy (2020 : Year 11 Leavers Cohort)

General Level of Involvement with a RPA destination within Central Bedfordshire



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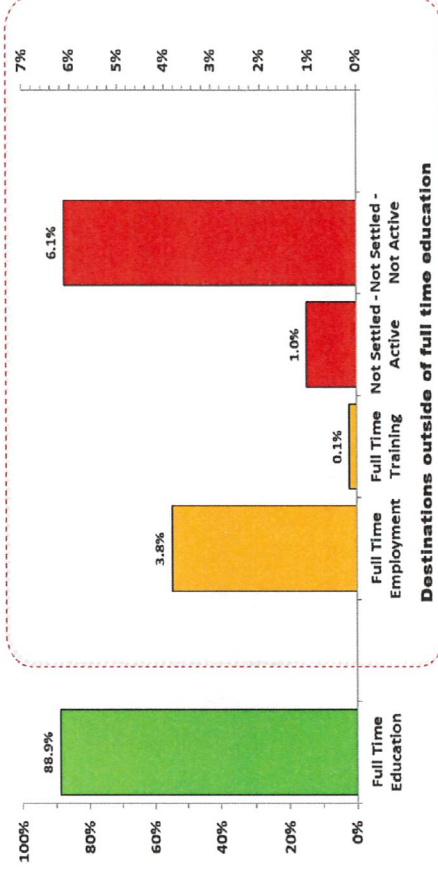

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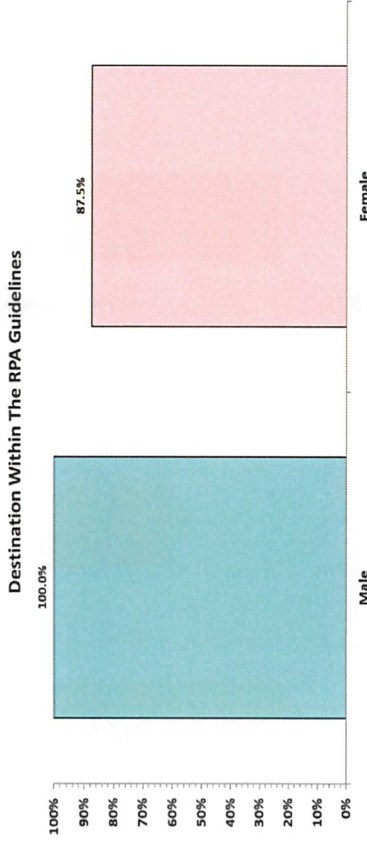
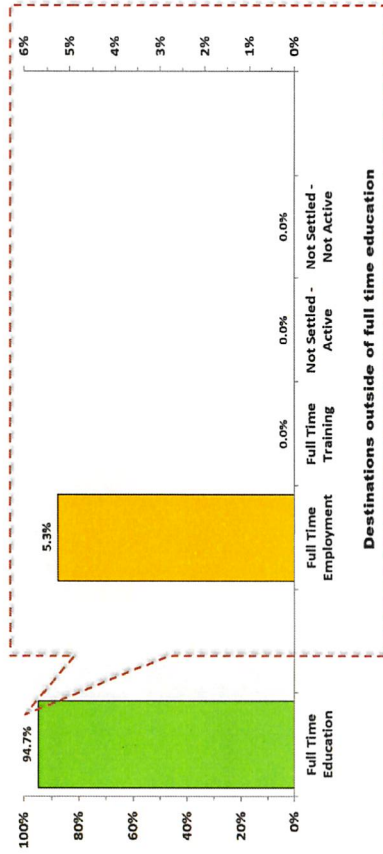
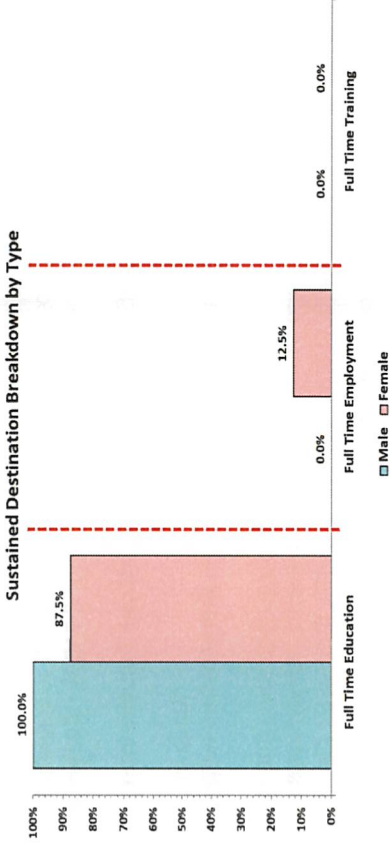
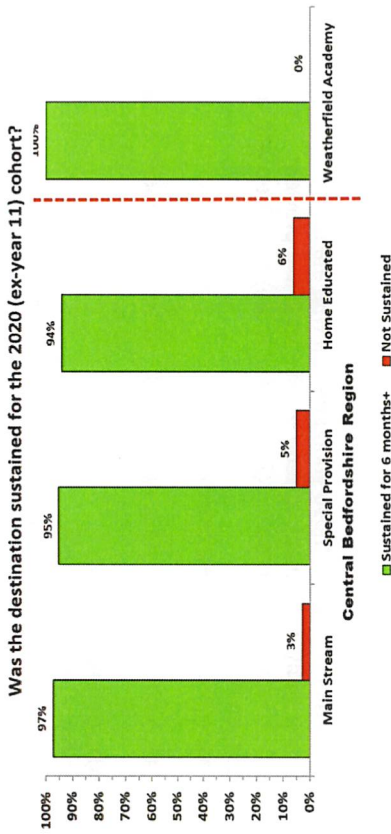
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Sustained Destinations for Weatherfield Academy (2020 : Year 11 Leavers Cohort)
