<p><u>Harvesting and Preparing for New Plant Life:</u></p> <p>The pupils will be involved in preparing the ground for planting seeds and bulbs. They will be weeding and raking leaves as well as digging in manure. The pupils will also learn about seed dispersal and where the seeds are found in flowering fruit vegetables and flowers.</p>	<p><u>Parts and Reproduction of plants: the plants and flowers we eat.</u></p> <p>The pupils will be learning about the reproduction of plants. They will be learning the different parts of a flower and the relationship between plants and insects.</p> <p>They will also be maintaining the school grounds and vegetable plot.</p>	<p><u>Food Where it comes from:</u></p> <p>The pupils will be learning about food. What parts of the fruit, vegetables or flowers we eat. They will be learning where food comes from and how far it travels.</p>	<p><u>Growing Plants: Emerging from plant beds.</u></p> <p>The pupils will be learning about germination and what plants need to germinate. They will be planting a variety of seeds for the vegetable plot and to decorate the school ground.</p>	<p><u>Animals that support plants:</u></p> <p>The pupils will be learning about bees and other insects that support the plants that support us. The pupils will be learning about pollination and the role of bees and other insects. As well as pets in the garden.</p>	<p><u>Hanging Gardens: A school garden in full bloom.</u></p> <p>The pupils will be planting a variety of plants around the school ground while maintaining the school grounds and vegetable patch.</p> <p>They will also be tasting edible flowers that the pupils have grown, not only taste good but are a pleasure to look at on the plate.</p>
